Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Lb 613 would tighten and extend the property tax asking lid, which affects subdivisions other than schools, in the following ways:

- 1. It excludes depreciable livestock from the prior year's valuation for purposes of calculating growth in valuation.
- 2. It decreases from 5% 1-0 4% the maximum c.p.i. increase which can be passed on a simple majority vote. Therefore, increases of a percentage

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between the CPI amount and 4% must be passed with a 75% approval of the governing body,' and increases beyond 4% must be passed by the voters.

3. It repeals outright the termination of the lid for budget year 1995-96.

The bill also would tighten the budget lid in place for schools as follows:

- 1. It repeals outright, section 79-3821 which allows unused budget authority to carry over.
- 2. It requires a special hearing. With seven days notice, before the budget can be increased more than zero percent to the otherwise allowable increase with a 75% vote of the school board and extends this zero percent increase provision indefinitely beyond the 1994-95 budget year.
- 3. It lowers the range of the original growth limitations from  $4-6 \frac{1}{2\%}$  to  $3-5 \frac{1}{2\%}$ .
- 4. It strikes the provision which allows up to 1% over the otherwise allowable range with a 75% vote of the school board.

The bill carries the emergency clause.

Explanation of amendments, if any:

The committee amendments

- 1) remove from the outright repealer section, section 79-3821, so that unused school budget authority would continue to carry over,
- 2) strike section 9 from the bill so that school boards may continue to increase expenditures 1% over the otherwise allowable limit with a 3/4 majority vote, and
- 3) change 4% to 3% on page 14. Line 22. Consistent with changes made elsewhere in the bill.
